

Auxiliary University Program Another Path to Becoming an Officer!

The Auxiliary University Program (AUP) prepares the best, brightest and most talented college students for success in service to their communities and country inside and outside of the Coast Guard at schools across the nation.

AUP students complete a Program of Study that exposes them to the Coast Guard and the Auxiliary while completing their major course studies. Students



join the Auxiliary, earn qualifications in areas such as boat crew, air crew, emergency management or public affairs. Upon graduation the students can apply for a commission as an officer in the Coast Guard through Officer Candidate School or through Direct Commissioning.



There are more than a dozen colleges that have a formal program. However, if there is no formal program at your college, you can participate by working with

a nearby auxiliary flotilla and completing training virtually as a member of the *Remote Collaborative Unit*. Both forms of the program offer training and the opportunity to intern at an active-duty Coast Guard unit before graduation.

Sea Scouts BSA is the Coast Guard Auxiliary's official youth program and is a Scouting America program for young men and women, ages 14 (or 13 years of age and completed eighth grade) through 20.

Ships (units) are supported by adult volunteers. Some ships are chartered by Auxiliary flotillas or divisions and they can be found throughout the country.

Any Sea Scout who is at least 14 years old, or Sea Scout adult may also choose to become U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary members by following the normal application process.

Young men and women of excellent character, high academic and athletic ability with strong leadership skills can become Coast Guard Officers by attending the Coast Guard Academy in New London, CT.

Acceptance to the Academy is merit based. It does not require a congressional nomination as do the other Federal Service Academies. It is tuition free, but you must serve for five years as a Coast Guard commissioned officer.

The students, known as cadets, pursue a liberal arts-based core curriculum with a heavy emphasis in STEM related subjects.
